Enrollment – 324

We have enrolled 5 more students since our last Board Meeting, with one more student expected next week.

Reopening Plan

After taking a look at the reopening plan, it was decided to make very few changes. This is due mostly to the high number of Covid-19 cases in Utah and in the community. That being said, we have adjusted quarantine requirements to be in line with updated CDC recommendations.

COVID CASES

One of the advantages of the two week soft closure prior to Thanksgiving was that it reset our

COVID cases. We currently have three faculty members out either waiting for test results or being quarantined due to potential exposure. There were a number of positive cases reported while we were on the soft dismissal, but these did not impact us.

SOFT DISMISSAL REPORT

During this two week closure, all classes were online. Teachers taught two live lessons each day. One in the morning, and one after lunch. Attendance at the morning live zoom classes averaged around 80%, but dropped off to around 50% for the afternoon class. All live sessions were recorded. Many families were able to access these lessons after school hours. The lunch room served up to 60 meals a day during this time.

HANDS FREE REFILLABLE WATER STATIONS

As of today, 4 of these stations have been installed. Another two will be installed by Monday. We are still waiting for delivery on others.

MARKETING

We had meetings with two different marketing companies this week. They are busy working on proposals.

These proposals include GeoTargeting specific zip codes. All devices in targeted area/households will receive advertising sent to social network sites, YouTube and Bonneville Owned and Operated websites.

The target audience would be households with kids 5-11. The Zips identified include some 28,000 parcels, with an estimated 40,000 devices.

We anticipate that this would cost in the range of \$12,000 - \$15,000 for the target months February – April, and July – September 2021.

At this point we want to gauge interest in pursuing this.
