Alternative Crisis Services

Services:

The Crisis Stabilization Units (CSU's) in San Diego County are welcoming environments where individuals in crisis can be assessed for stabilization services, medication evaluation and management, or hospitalization if necessary. The CSU's welcomes adults 18 years and older.

Depending on the needs of the client, our interdisciplinary treatment team is prepared to offer crisis intervention services, psychiatric evaluation, medication services, referral and linkage to appropriate level of continuing care, and community services.

The Crisis Stabilization Unit is Lanterman Petris Short (LPS) designated which allows our staff to evaluate and involuntarily detain those individuals determined to be a danger to themselves or others or gravely disabled.

Clients will receive comprehensive mental health services for up to 24 hours while enrolled at the CSU.





Services Offered:

- 24-hour psychiatric crisis center open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days per year.
- A welcoming environment where the needs of the client are assessed and crisis intervention services provided.
- Comprehensive services:
 - Mental health assessment
 - Medication evaluation and management
 - Therapeutic interventions
 - Social services and referrals including a variety of discharge plans that range from home to hospital
- Services provided by an interdisciplinary team of Psychiatrists, Nurse Practitioners, Registered Nurses, Licensed Clinical Social Workers, Licensed Marriage Therapists, Mental Health Specialists and Peer Specialists.
