Earn College Credits in High School

Concurrent enrollment (CE) is a program that allows high school students to earn college credit by taking college courses taught at their high school, online, or on a college campus. It's a great way to get a jumpstart on your college education and save money!

Concurrent enrollment offers great opportunities, but it's important to be aware of the risks. The grades you earn in these classes will become a permanent part of your academic record and cannot be retaken or replaced while in High School. To receive credit, you must earn a grade of C or higher. Additionally, neither your school nor your parents will have access to your progress or grades until they are officially posted at the end of the semester. Please consider these factors carefully before enrolling.

Summit Academy High School students currently have multiple schools to choose from that offer concurrent enrollment:

*Students may take classes from multiple colleges and do not have to choose just one.

SLCC

- Classes only available to Juniors and Seniors
- Classes offered online and at SLCC campus
- Tuition is \$5 per credit hour plus any class fees
- Offers free STEM tutoring to students

SUU

- Classes are available to Freshmen through Seniors
- Offers online classes only
- Tuition is \$5 per credit hour plus any class fees
- Minimum of 3.0 GPA is required. Reach out to your concurrent enrollment coordinator for exceptions

U OF U HSUP PROGRAM

- Classes are available to Sophomores through Seniors
- Offers in-person classes at U of U campus
- Tuition is \$5 per credit hour plus any class fees
- Minimum of 3.2 GPA is required for seniors, 3.5 for Juniors, and 3.7 for Sophomores

MTECH

- Offers a variety of in person, hands-on trade school programs
- Most programs are offered to Juniors and Seniors
- SAHS will pay a portion of tuition
- Some programs offer credit transferable to UVU

How to Apply & Register

Step 1

Apply to SLCC and set up your MYSLCC login. Applications can take time to process, so please apply at least two weeks before the registration deadline.

Step 2

Look through the Class Schedule to see what classes you would like to take. Talk to the concurrent enrollment coordinator in the Counseling office if you need help choosing classes. Up to 3 classes may be taken each semester.

Make sure to turn in the signed Memorandum of Understanding form below to your concurrent enrollment coordinator in the counseling office. It only needs to be filled out once.

How to Apply & Register:

Step 1

Apply to SUU. The application process can take 2-3 weeks so please apply early.

Step 2

Once you have been accepted, you will receive an acceptance email. Use the link in the email to create a student portal. Look through the class list to see what classes you are interested in taking. Talk to your counselor if you need help deciding.

Step 3

Login to your student portal and register for classes. Make sure to tell your counselor which classes you have registered for. Click on the link below for a video tutorial on how to register for classes.

Step 4

Pay tuition. Tuition will be discounted to the concurrent enrollment rate (\$5 per credit hour) but students will still be responsible for paying any class fees. Pay by the class drop deadline to avoid fees.

U of U HSUP Program

University of Utah High School University Program

Requirements:

- Successfully complete ninth grade.
- Be actively enrolled in a Utah high school (or home-schooled). Students cannot be graduating from high school prior to or during the semester they wish to enroll in HSUP.
- Meet the minimum GPA requirement developed by the Credits and Admissions Committee
 - Seniors—3.2 GPA or higher
 - Juniors—3.5 GPA or higher
 - Sophomores—3.7 GPA or higher

HSUP students must maintain a 2.0 or higher cumulative University of Utah GPA. If a student's University of Utah cumulative GPA falls below a 2.0 in HSUP courses, they will be dismissed from the program.

Step 1

Complete the High School University Application. Upload a signed parent consent form during the application process.

Upload an unofficial high school transcript in the application portal upon submission of the application. View the status of your application in the Application Portal.
